

Some examples of Playgrounds in Berlin

On a recent visit to Berlin we were taken to view a several playgrounds. Some photos of the playgrounds are shown below. The playgrounds were designed and built by SIK Holz a German company. The first playground was based in a social housing complex and was designed to serve that area. The second, 'the sunken ship' was similarly placed adjacent to a social housing complex. The third was a much larger playground situated in a large municipal park. The final picture an oddity that I liked is a slide attached to a primary school as a quick way to escape or a play resource?

Playground 1



A playground with lots of varied equipment for swinging, climbing and sliding. The whole playground uses sand as a safety surface. We visited in early afternoon on a cool March day and there were many children playing on the site some with their parents and some on their own.

Playground 2



Playground was built around the theme of a sunken ship. Interesting walkways and mounds representing the 'sea'. The overall site was quite large but with little equipment except for the main ship. In the afternoon there were no children at the site.

Playground 3



This a large playground in a municipal park loosely based around the theme of Aladdin with a galleon as the main item of equipment. A large number of children and their families were on the site. Once again the playground used sand as the safety surface in this case it was also a major play resource in its own right.
